As the tribe and medical center consider reopening, we wish to estimate the current prevalence of COVID-19 infection in the community.





Testing strategy to detect on average 1 positive would be to test at least 20 people.

Testing same individuals every 2 weeks

Adequate time for incubation

Preserving testing resources
