

Prevalence of Hepatitis C Antibody Positivity in US Population by Sex by Yr of




But...

New cases of acute Hepatitis C infection have nearly tripled over last 5 years

Highest overall number of new infections among 20-29 year olds (due to increasing injection drug use)


► HCV infections are growing among women of childbearing age



► Injection drug use now accounts for at least 60 percent of HCV transmission in the United States.

> 75-90% of PWID are HCV Ab positive.

Deaths from prevalent HCV forecasted to peak in 2030s...



Unless something changes

Trifecta of interventions needed

Anti-virals (treat the infections)

PWID

Needle and syringe programs (decrease risk of infection)

Medications for OUD (decrease the risk of injecting)

Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD)

Opioid Agonists



Methadone

Full agonist at the opioid receptor

Half life greater than 24 hours

OTP only

Ok to dispense in hospitals

Methadone


Decreases use of illicit opioids

Increases retention in treatment

Decreases incidence of new HIV/Hepatitis C infections

Reduces criminality

Mortality Risk during and after methadone treatment





Buprenorphine


Partial agonist at the opioid receptor

Prescribers must have DATA waiver

Patient limits

Ok to dispense in hospitals

The Buprenorphine Effect



Log Dose

SAMHSA chart shows how buprenorphine works to ease withdrawal while producing less euphoric opioid effects


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
Mortality Risk during and after buprenorphine treatment

Mortality rates/1000 person years (95% CI)



XR Naltrexone



XR Naltrexone



XR Naltrexone

One 380 mg deep muscle injection in the buttock every 4 weeks

No special waiver training

Need to be opioid free

1/4 patients do not tolerate induction

No good data on mortality or reduction in HIV/Hep C

Summary

To prevent Hepatitis C, treat addiction and emphasize harm reduction

Methadone and buprenorphine use are significantly associated with decreased risk of HIV/Hep C infection

Extended release naltrexone treats opioid use disorder. It is unclear if it also decreases risk of new infections

Also, don't forget to prescribe naloxone!!!
