







- Overall flu vaccination coverage of 37.1% for IHS Active Clinical Population
- Increase in children vaccinated through Week 8


Percent of Active Clinical Population with at least 1 dose of flu vaccine, by Area, 2019-2020




Number of flu doses administered and Number of facilities reporting

Best Practices for Influenza Vaccination

- Plan ahead, communicate, get buy-in from internal stakeholders
- Outreach to <u>external</u> stakeholders, community leaders during the planning phase
- Nurse-only immunization clinics daily, Pharmacy, ER, Inpatient
- Utilize standing orders, avoid missed opportunities by offering at every visit
- Look for opportunities to vaccinate beyond routine clinic visits- Schools, Community Centers, Parking lot "Drive-throughs", elder programs, community events
- Advertise using local media resources, clinic facebook and websites
- Protect elders by vaccinating children, elders and those that care for them- everyone 6 months and older!
