- CHRs may provide intensive patient counseling in a variety of settings including Homes, senior sites, community, during transport




Health Behavior

Karl and Cobb (1966) defined three types of health related behaviors. They suggested that:

- 1 a health behavior is a behavior aimed at preventing disease
- 2. An illness behavior is a behavior aimed at seeking a remedy
- 3. A sick role behavior is an activity aimed at getting well

Impacts Health



TYPES OF HEALTH BEHAVIOR CHANGES

Establish new healthy behaviors

- Taking Medication as prescribed.
- Participating in regular physical activity.
- Consuming low fat food products.


Increasing existing healthy behaviors

- Scheduling more regular doctor appointments.
- Ensuring adequate amounts of sleep.
- Increasing consumption of fibers, fruits and vegetables.

Decreasing unhealthy behaviors

- Decreasing amount of salt and sugar in diet.
- Quitting smoking
- Reducing daily alcohol consumption.
