# Working with the Center



By creating meaningful connections that support and honor American Indian and Alaska Native beliefs and cultural values, the Center assists Tribes and Tribal programs with their anti-trafficking work.

## **Partner with the Center to develop—**

- Community outreach plans and culturally-appropriate materials to educate Tribal communities on human trafficking.
- A collaborative and community-based response to human trafficking.
- Strategic plans for community response teams focused on human trafficking.



# Culturally-Specific Support for Tribal Communities

The Center proactively reaches out to Tribal communities offering various human trafficking resources, such as—

- American Indian and Alaska Native Advisory Committee
- Community of Care virtual, small group, peer-to-peer conversations where participants put their knowledge into action and grow their circle of support.
- Individual and tailored discussions aligned to program needs and interests.
- Reawakening the Spirit podcast
- Regional In-Person Gatherings deepen knowledge about human trafficking while strengthening peer networks and relationships.

# Case Study: North Carolina Medical Center

## The Center assisted with—

- Enhancing human trafficking education and awareness among Medical Facility staff,
- Developing human trafficking victim response protocols, and
- Creating a partnership plan supporting comprehensive service provision for all victims of human trafficking in their community



The North Carolina Medical Center requested assistance with increasing their human trafficking identification within the Emergency Department, ensuring more survivors have access to comprehensive services through internal or external programs.

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Pre-recorded human trafficking trainings for medical staff to watch when convenient for them.



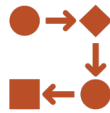
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Human trafficking awareness poster for internal staff.
