Background

Workforce challenges, South Dakota survey, and Governor Noem's Vision



Challenge: Workforce

Crippling shortage can impact entire communities

2020 American Ambulance Association survey of 258 EMS agencies found:

- Annual turnover rates ranges from 20 to 30 percent
- 100% turnover rate over a four-year period
- 1/3 of the EMS workforce left after less than a year, 11% left within the first three months



48% of agencies have 10 or less members on their roster

63% of agencies do not view the current staffing model as sustainable

73% of agencies use volunteer labor

Only 40% of agencies view local service as having adequate numbers for safe and humane staffing

30% of volunteer agencies were aware of delayed or missed calls in past 2 years due to staff availability



Here to Meet the Need

From the RFP:

"The Department of Health Office of Rural Health is seeking a vendor to provide telehealth services to Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in South Dakota including hardware, software, implementation, training, and professional services."

From Governor Noem's Budget Address:

"Telehealth services will allow collaboration between hospital, medical professionals and EMS personnel to improve efficiencies in patient assessment, treatment, and transportation to definitive care centers."

Additional Considerations:

- Support existing EMS workforce and reduce burnout
- Create a pipeline to improve the recruitment of new EMS personnel across the state







Telemedicine in Motion

- Harnessing Avel eCare's three decades of experience to install and operate telehealth-enabled iPads in the back of EMS agency ambulances across the state of South Dakota.
- Whenever the EMS professionals need help, they can quickly call and interact with doctors and nurses while in transit.





How it Works

1. EMS crew calls Avel eCare to initiate a video encounter



2. Within moments, Avel's ER team responds to assist



3. Team of board-certified ER doctors and nurses stay on the call for as long as it takes




Current State

Live Sites, reporting and data, and success stories




Current Statistics




- We achieved our initial goal of 60 sites live by the beginning of June '23 and plan for 100 by the end of the implementation roll out.
- We have experienced a high level of interest in participation in the program with over 90% wanting to participate in the program








EMS Agency Survey Responses
