# Crisis situation created opportunities in Great Plains Area (GPA)

- 2015 Rosebud ED shut down due to multiple CMS CoP failures: Opened up possibilities to collaborate
- 2016 Rosebud enters into first academic relationship with MGH to provide OPC services
- Included rotating mid-level provider students and rotating faculty
- 2019 Rosebud enters into IPAs with multiple MGH physicians to provide hospitalist coverage

## Cheyenne River Health Center (CRHC): 2021

- 1. Entered into IPAs with Mt Sinai ED physicians to provide rotating ED coverage with faculty and residents at CRHC
- 2. Entered into IPAs with Boston Children's Hospital and U. Minnesota physicians to provide pediatric OPC and hospital coverage
