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


Assessment

- -Walk them if possible
- -Finger to nose



Treatment

Oxygen

Fluids

Pain meds

Avoid Opiates


-Acetaminophen or low dose keatmine are ideal

Most common type of headache "Band like pain"



Cluster Headache

More common in men and smokers

Attacks come in clusters

Pressure behind one eye +/- tearing

Tx is O2

Concussion


Blow to head

Confusion

Nausea/Vomiting

Post-concussive symptoms can last for weeks



Subdural hematoma

Venous injury

- -Advanced age
- -Alcoholism
- -Anticoagulation

Can accumulate slowly




Traumatic Subarachnoid

Venous shear injury

Blood collects in the sulci




Infectious Causes of Headache



Sinusitis

Pressure in sinuses, congestion

Associated with allergies, cold symptoms




Meningitis

Can be viral, bacterial or fungal


Bacterial form is highly contagious

Headache +fever/rash= *PPE*

Can progress to septic shock, seizures



Vascular Causes of Headache




Spontaneous Subarachnoid

Worst headache of my life

Can lead to seizures, stroke symptoms

Usually young

Mortality approaches 40%




Temporal Arteritis

Inflammation of the Temporal Artery

Pain with chewing

Blurred vision


Tenderness to palpation



Carotid Artery Dissection

Symptoms: Headache, neck pain, vision changes, stroke symptoms.


Causes: Chiropractic manipulation, sports injuries, motor vehicle collisions, strangulation



Dural Venous Sinus Thrombosis

Symptoms: Headache, vision changes, stroke symptoms

Risk factors: Clotting disorder, hormones, infections, trauma.

Mass Effect


Most brain tumors are mets from elsewhere



VP Shunt

Shunt can become clogged due to hardware issue or infection


Overdrainage can also cause headache




Preeclampsia

Hypertension is ALWAYS AN EMERGENCY in a pregnant patient.
