We hope to bring together community leaders, nurses, administrators, medics, physicians, pharmacists, pre-health students, and all who are interested, to share our stories, culture, history, language, smiles and good humor, to learn from one another, and to discuss opportunities Emergency Departments have to better serve rural and Indigenous communities. We will host an optional pre-conference session focused on building and supporting the workforce providing emergency care on the afternoon of September 26.
