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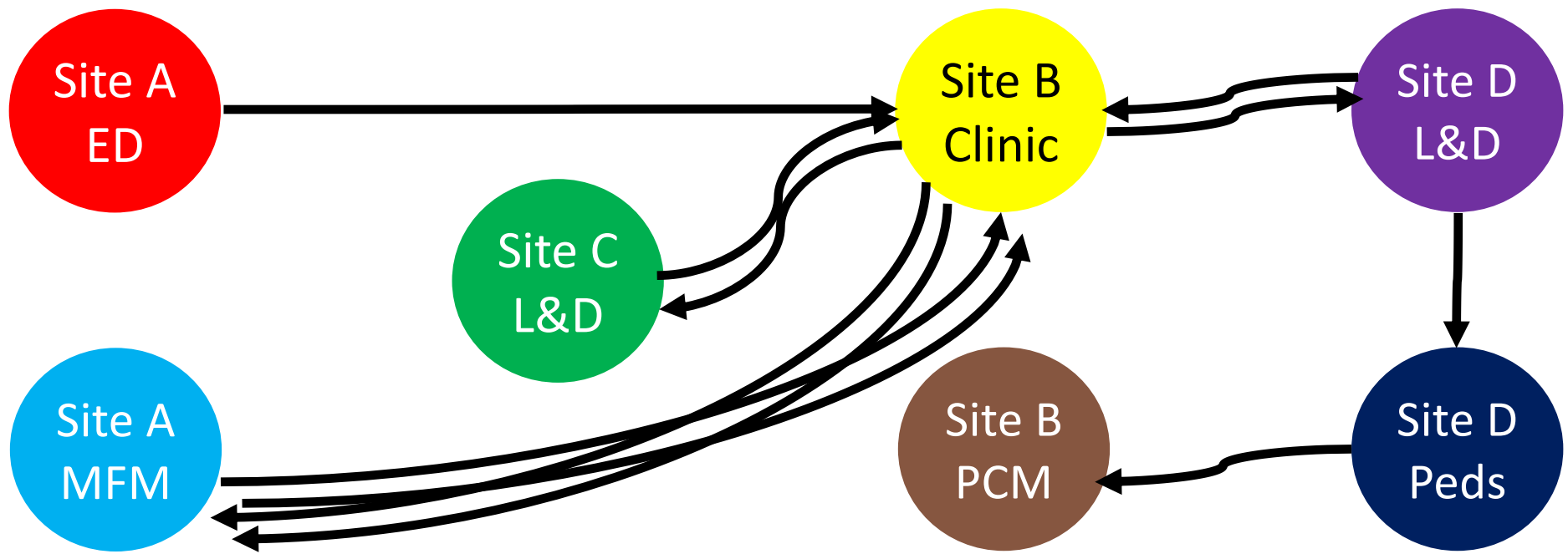


Lived Experience

- 34 yo G4 P3 with a history of hypertension, lives near Site B and visiting family at Site A
- **Site A ED**
 - C/o pain with urination
 - Positive pregnancy test, 12 wga by LMP
 - Treated for UTI, prenatal labs drawn- pending
- **Site B Clinic: 16 wga by u/s**
 - Establish prenatal care
 - Prenatal labs reordered
- **Site C L&D: 20 wga**
 - C/o cramping
 - Positive syphilis from Site A, PCN #1
- **Site A MFM: 24 wga**
 - Growth ultrasound
 - Antepartum testing
- **Site B Clinic: 28 weeks**
 - Completed treatment for syphilis
 - Partner did not complete treatment, patient unknowingly reinfected
- **Site D L&D**
 - Newborn delivered, diagnosed with congenital syphilis
 - Patient overhears staff discussing case and “failure of mother” to comply with treatment
- **Site D Pediatric Clinic: 2 wk pp**
 - C/o difficulty sleeping
 - Referred to PCM
- **Site B PCM: 8 wk pp**
 - C/o headache
 - Elevated blood pressure
 - Positive depression screening
